# TRANSFORMING

## BAPTIST for the FUTURE



This year **Baptist Hospital** celebrated its one-year anniversary at its new location at Brent Lane and I-110.

Completing the historical move was the result of intensive planning and a collaborative effort of 1,100 Baptist team members, multiple area emergency response teams and many community partners.

Since that day, the Baptist team has provided care for thousands of individuals from throughout the community. Due to growth at the new campus and across the organization, more than 1,350 new team members have been hired. The campus has hosted many free community seminars with hundreds in attendance, as well as more than 45 team member recruitment events.

Through the generous support of our donors, the dedication of our skilled providers and the pursuit of excellence by our team members, we are able to bring the next generation of health care to our community.



# MAJOR GIFT DONORS

## Sandy Sansing Family

The Sandy Sansing family made a generous **\$200,000** contribution to support the new Baptist Hospital campus. The Foundation named the **outpatient lab** on the first floor of the Bear Family Foundation Health Center in the family's honor. The Sansing family has been passionate about giving back to help others in the Pensacola community for many years through health care projects, educational scholarships and programs that support children in need. Sandy Sansing served on the Baptist board of directors for more than 20 years, serving as chairman for 10 of those years. He became an honorary board member in 2000.



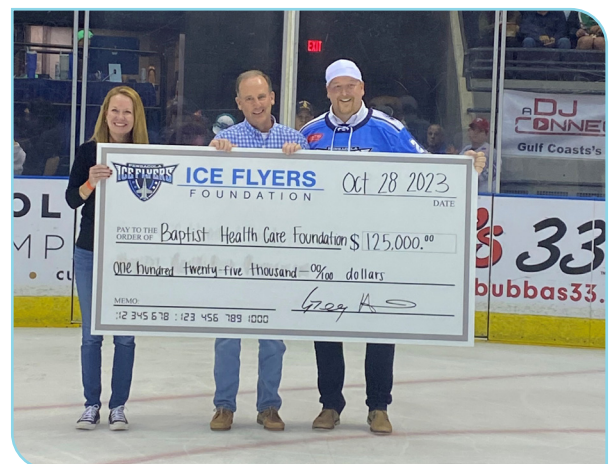
## Fred and Susie Donovan

Fred and Susie Donovan's faces light up when talking about their grandchildren, as family has always been the focal point for the Donovans. Fred became CEO of Baskerville-Donovan, Inc., a 100-year-old local engineering firm, in 1965 and then chairman in a consulting role in 2021. Throughout his career, he was very active in the community. He served on Baptist boards from 1983 to 2010, with many years as chairman or vice chairman. In 2011, Fred was recognized as an honorary board member, and in 2018, he was awarded the Baptist Health Care Foundation Hollinger Award for Lifetime Achievement to honor his long-term commitment to Baptist. The Donovans made a **\$100,000** gift to support the new Baptist Hospital campus. The Foundation named the **hybrid operating room** in their honor.



## Pensacola Ice Flyers

Greg Harris started playing hockey when he was 3 years old. He became the majority owner of the Ice Flyers in the 2012-2013 season, and the team has since brought home four championships in the Southern Professional Hockey League and a continuous top three ranking in the league for game attendance. Greg, on behalf of his family back home in Canada and his Ice Flyers family, made a **\$125,000** gift to support the new Baptist Hospital campus – the largest donation to date in the Ice Flyers' history. The Foundation named the **outpatient pharmacy** in honor of his dad, who is a pharmacist, and the **oncology conference room** in honor of his mom, who is a cancer survivor. Both are located inside the Bear Family Foundation Health Center.



## Sammye and Ken Simpler Family

For the Simpler family, giving back to their community has always been a priority. Growing up, Sammye learned the importance of helping others from her grandfather, who founded Publix, a Florida-based company that has incorporated a giving culture for more than 90 years within the communities that they serve. Sammye instilled those same values into her children, Lea Richardson and Clay Simpler, who also grew up working in the family business and seeing first-hand the impact that philanthropy can have on a community. The Simpler family made a **\$250,000** gift to the Baptist Health Care Foundation. The Foundation has named Baptist Hospital's **women's imaging center** in honor of their transformational gift.



## Leadership Giving Society

Our Leadership Giving Society is comprised of Baptist team members who choose to give \$500 or more per year to the Foundation. Their gifts over the last three years, totaling \$150,000, were used to support our Transforming Baptist for the Future campaign. The Foundation named three areas in the new Baptist Hospital/Bear Family Foundation Health Center in recognition of these generous donations: the **3rd floor family lounge/waiting area**, a **CT scan room** and the **infusion nurse station**.

# MAJOR PROJECTS SUPPORTED

## Surgery Equipment

In July 2024, Baptist employed a new gastroenterologist, John Magulick. Dr. Magulick has special privileges to perform diagnostic and therapeutic endoscopic ultrasound (EUS). Baptist is the only local hospital offering this procedure.



The Foundation donated **\$185,000** towards the purchase of the **Olympus Endoscopic Ultrasound (EUS) machine and scopes**, which combines ultrasound and conventional endoscopy technologies to see beyond the walls of the gastrointestinal tract. The machine also allows endoscopists to visualize all five layers of the GI tract and surrounding organs and tissues.

This equipment allows Dr. Magulick to diagnose conditions in the esophagus, stomach, duodenum, colon, rectum and other nearby organs like the lungs, pancreas, liver and gallbladder. In addition to diagnosing, he can help with staging cancers in these parts of the body and detect cancer's effect on lymph nodes and blood vessels. The ultrasound increases precision and accuracy, as well as access.

## Youth Mental Health First Aid

Baptist Behavioral Health Unit (BHU) provides inpatient behavioral health care to more than 3,400 patients each year. More than 1,400 are children aged 10 to 17 years, although services are provided for patients as young as age 5. The BHU team continuously strives to raise awareness and support about the importance and critical need of behavioral health care in our community through various outreach efforts.

Baptist BHU is now spearheading an important training to our community, free of charge. **Youth Mental Health First Aid** is a full-day course on how to help a youth that may be struggling with mental health difficulties. The course is designed for an adult or peer to recognize signs of depression, anxiety, substance abuse and other mental health challenges in youths that are close to us. The course uses a combination of communication styles, tools, observations and self-care to provide immediate care in the situation. Youth Mental Health First Aid will provide basic first aid knowledge so that students will know what to do in the short term to prevent a situation from escalating and how to find the most appropriate help. This valuable course is encouraged for teachers, coaches, counselors, church leaders or families who interact with youth on a regular basis.



Through funding from the BHU Fund within the Foundation, Amber Sufnar and Andy Barrett have completed both Mental Health Aid and Youth Mental Health First Aid training and have become certified instructors for Youth Mental Health First Aid. They taught their first class in October for the Escambia County Council PTA-PTSA and have more classes planned in the future. The Foundation also purchased the Youth Mental Health First Aid training manuals to be given to all program participants.



## Scottish Rite Foundation

The Scottish Rite Foundation Childhood Language Disorders Program strives to make Northwest Florida a better place by providing speech and language screening and treatment to children who would otherwise be unable to receive care. Over the last **26 years**, the Scottish Rite Foundation of Florida has donated **\$875,000** to the Baptist Foundation to support these children in need.

The program operates within Andrews Institute Rehabilitation speech therapy offices in three Baptist locations: Henderson Health Center on the Baptist Hospital campus, Baptist Medical Park – Nine Mile and Gulf Breeze Hospital.



*A 5-year-old male patient was previously receiving speech therapy at another location which was requiring full payment out of pocket. Unfortunately, due to health issues within the family, this is unattainable for them. The child has both articulation/phonological delay and difficulty with pragmatic language skills. Initially, he was reluctant to respond to interventions and had difficulty with eye contact, following directions and making his wants and needs known. Now, the child responds to therapy and is following instructions. Eye contact is improving, along with increased accuracy of speech sounds. The family is grateful to Scottish Rite for providing funding that is allowing this child to make gains in communication. I am grateful to be able to watch this child progress and excited to see what his communication future holds.*

# 47TH ANNUAL STEPPING OUT IN STYLE FASHION SHOW

The 47th annual **Stepping Out in Style Fashion Show**, presented by the Women's Board of Baptist Health Care Foundation, raised more than **\$135,000** to support the **senior adult space within the Behavioral Health Unit (BHU)** at the new Baptist Hospital campus.

These patients require special consideration in mobility, more advanced medical care, lower stimulus environments and varying treatments to provide cognitive care. The senior adult social space offers comfortable furnishings that assist in preventing falls, allows therapeutic services in a welcoming, healing environment and enables patients to receive care in a space designed to make them feel at home.

The fashion show is the largest fundraiser for the Women's Board. The event was held on Oct. 26, 2023, at Sanders Beach Corinne-Jones Resource Center and featured live and silent auctions and emcees Brent Lane and Sue Straughn. Professional and local models showcased the latest fashions from Bluetique, Dillard's, The Market and Mainly Shoes and The South Outfitters.









# CASINO ROYALE

This elegant black-tie event brings together Baptist leaders and vendors for a night of first-class dining, dancing, charity auctions and charitable gaming. Each year, Casino Royale is inspired by a James Bond movie, with this year's event featuring themes from *GoldenEye*.

The 10th annual **Casino Royale Gala** took place on April 19, 2024, and raised nearly **\$290,000**. Proceeds benefitted **Baptist's faith and community health programs and initiatives**.

Baptist is committed to addressing the holistic needs of individuals and families in our community, particularly through partnerships with local faith-based organizations and community groups. Through these partnerships, Baptist has been able to reach thousands of individuals through health care navigation, health education and health screenings. The goal is to ensure that community members enter the system at the right place, at the right time, for the right reason, and understand that they are not alone.









# HELPING HANDS TEAM MEMBER GIVING

Baptist Health Care team members have incredible impact to the Foundation through donations to the **Helping Hands Fund**. Last year, team members contributed **\$220,504** to financially support three focus areas: assisting team members and their families directly, giving back to our communities and supporting our organizational Mission of helping people throughout life's journey.

## TEAM MEMBER IMPACT

- **Emergency Assistance** – **\$55,635** total financial assistance was provided to **48** team members to support them through catastrophic events.
- **Educational Scholarships** – **35** educational scholarships were awarded to team members and their dependents in the amount of **\$1,000** each.
- **Holiday Food Assistance** – **94** team members received food card assistance.
- **Adoption/Foster Care Assistance** – Assistance is available for team members who adopt or earn foster care certification and begin fostering a child(ren).

## COMMUNITY IMPACT

- **C.A. Weis Elementary School** – **500** students received Christmas gifts.
- **United Way of West Florida** – A **\$20,000** donation impacted **25** partner agency programs.
- **Mission Trip Support** – **Five** team members received assistance to support mission trip efforts.

## ORGANIZATIONAL IMPACT

- **Mini-Grants Program** – **10** grants were awarded to departments system-wide for a total impact of **\$34,600**.

## Mission Trip Impact

Dave Crawford, manager of pharmacy informatics, and his wife, Vicki, have been going on annual mission trips to Santa Rosita, Lima, Peru with nonprofit organization Reimagine Worldwide for more than 20 years. The Reimagine Peru team works with people in the town to help meet physical, emotional and spiritual needs. During his most recent trip, Dave and the team built five houses. They also helped with caring for medical needs, getting children school-ready, counseling and prayer sessions. Each day, the children get to experience a vacation Bible school-type setting and recreation time where they play soccer with the American visitors and local community.

“Our goal is for the community to be as self-supporting as possible, but our organization does provide an additional safety net,” Dave said. “Many individuals, churches and other organizations provide support to Reimagine Peru. I know from seeing the organization and missions up close, that all contributions are money well spent. I can say the same for my time invested.”

Used for diagnostic exams in radiology to assess patient’s ability to swallow

Used for ultrasound patients who are often cold and uncomfortable during procedures

Used for patient support and therapy activities

## **Video Camera Equipment – Baptist Health Care, Marketing and Communications**

Used to produce high-quality video material for patient communication and education

## **Fighting Obesity in Primary Care: G6 Body Composition Scale – Baptist Medical Group Convenient Care – Southtowne**

Used to provide body composition measurements on the spot

## **Controlling Diabetes: A1C Machine – Baptist Medical Group Primary Care – Live Oak**

Used to provide faster testing and resulting of lab work

## **IV Chair with Bariatric Weight Limit – Baptist Medical Park – Nine Mile, Imaging, CT and MRI**

Used to efficiently prepare patients with bariatric needs for contrast exams



## Mini-Grants Impact

Stand Assist Device – Jay Hospital

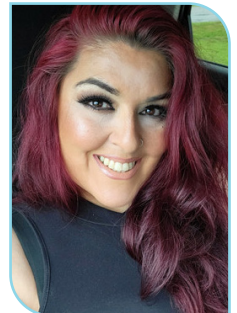


“We had a patient who was admitted into skilled care for 16 days. The patient required physical and occupational therapy. The patient was an 86-year-old male whose prior functioning level was partial assistance at home with a rolling walker for getting around. The patient experienced a fall at home and required repair of his hip due to a fracture. On the patient’s initial physical therapy evaluation, he was only able to move 6 feet with a rolling walker and required moderate assistance when going from sitting to standing. The patient also required multiple prompts from the physical therapy, occupational therapy and nursing team for him to straighten his back and look forward rather than looking down. The patient was not able to stand for long periods of time, and his knees would buckle. The physical therapy team decided to incorporate the stand assist device as part of his therapy to help build core strength, restore the patient’s confidence in looking forward and improve endurance with standing. The patient was able to return home, and upon discharge, was walking 90 feet with partial assistance and a rolling walker.”

# MAMMOGRAM FUND

The Foundation's **Mammogram Fund** provides mammograms year-round to community members who are uninsured and helps raise awareness about the importance of breast health. This program would not be possible without the generous support of our donors who contributed **\$141,975** this year.

Over the last **15 years** of this program, screenings have been provided to **2,947** people. As a result of these screenings, **792** required additional testing, **100** required biopsies and **32** were diagnosed with breast cancer

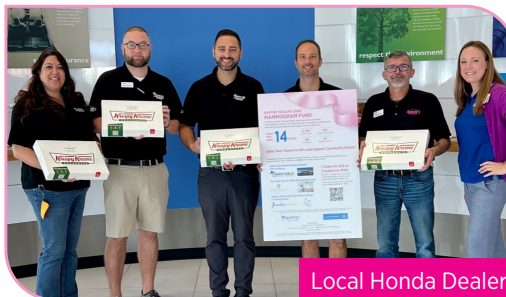
